There are to be NO children under the age of 16 in charge of handling dogs

Be mindful of the rope whilst on the course

Be aware of electrical cords and hoses across the grounds

Wear closed in shoes only, NO thongs, NO crocks, NO sandals

Don't stand around the gate unless your group has been called and you are the next entry

Once your dog has finished its race, exit through the designated exit gate, **NOT** the entry gate

Watch for ants and other biting insects

Keep your dogs on a short lead, and away from other dogs

NO extension leads/flexi leads

We recommend you crate your dog/s and ensure they are not left unsupervised whilst waiting their turn

Please keep your dogs race number on you at all times!


NEW LOOK FOR THE PURSUIT

I can also be identified by my obnoxiously purple hair. Please don't be afraid to come say hi to us! Whether it just be for a chat, feedback, even if you have a suggestion or something to submit to The Pursuit!

Member contributions and feedback are always welcomed and even encouraged! Whether it be a comic or drawing, a breed specific article, even just a funny meme you think others would get a kick out of!







The hot Australian sun is no joke. We all know how to "Slip, Slop, Slap" to keep ourselves safe, but what about our dogs? Do you know how to keep them safe in the sweltering Aussie sun? Especially at Lure Coursing?

What can you do to help your 4 legged friend beat the heat at Lure Coursing?

1. Provide Shade

While your dog is waiting their turn to run, keep them cool in the shade. Finding a shady spot with a breeze is best! Members are encouraged to bring along a Gazebo and set it up in the dog park!

2. Lots of Water

Ensure your dog has access to water! It's extremely important to stay hydrated on hot days, especially if you're running around! However, do not let them drink too much immediately after running, as they may regurgitate the water, thus dehydrating them further.

3. Consider Protective Clothing

Consider buying some protective clothing for your dogs, such as a specialized cooling coat or even a rashie. Anything to keep the sun off them helps!

4. Use a Doggy-Safe Sunscreen!

There are plenty of dog safe sunscreens out there on the market! Invisible Zinc can also be used! Always do a test patch on your pooch first before applying it all over their body, just to make sure they don't have a reaction!

5. Avoid Concrete

Avoid letting your dog stand on the hot concrete! Burnt paw pads are no fun.





How am I supposed to know when it's my dogs turn to run?

A typical day at Lure Coursing starts with puppy runs and first time runners. These runs are just for fun and to see if your dog will chase the lure, and are not scored.

Dogs are then called by their ANKC group number to start warming up and make their way to the gate. Groups are NOT called in order.

- Group 1 (Toys)
- Group 2 (Terriers)
- Group 3 (Gundogs)
- Group 4 (Hounds)***
- Group 5 (Working)
- Group 6 (Utility)
- Group 7 (Non Sporting)

***For the purposes of Lure Coursing, Italian Greyhounds are run in Group 4

Dogs that do not have ANKC registration papers, and mixed breed dogs are still able to run! These dogs run in the "Unregistered" Group.

Dogs that are aged 7 or older will run in the "Veteran" Group, and generally will do a half run.

It is recommended to warm your dog up once your group has been called to the gate. Warming your dog up helps to prevent muscle sprains, stiffness and injuries. Warming your dog can be as simple as taking them on a short walk, trotting them around in a circle, even playing tug!

After your dog has run, it is advised to take a short walk and let your dog "cool down". Make sure you give your 4 legged friend a drink, but do not let them drink too much as they may regurgitate the water, thus dehydrating them further.

Whilst your dog is scored on their performance, Lure Coursing is designed to be a fun sport for the dogs. At the end of the day, they don't know what they scored, they just care about catching that darn plastic bag!





HOW IS A DOG SCORED/JUDGED AT LURE COURSING?

Your dog is evaluated on the following points as it is not just a test of speed. Each run your dog does will get a score out of 100 points.

ENTHUSIASM: (Max 15 Points)

Lively, single minded, showing great eagerness and determination in regard to the lure, after the start and until the lure returns to the catching pen for the course.

SKILL: (Max 15 Points)

The behaviours the dog displays during the course that relate to its intent to hunt and take the lure. Course taken in relation to where the lure is heading or the anticipation of where the lure is likely to immediately head. Awareness of the location of the lure on the course or actions taken to relocate the lure. Reaction time to movement in lure direction or speed.

SPEED: (Max 25 Points)

Rapidity in moving, the rate of moving or progress. Credit goes to the dog that levels out low, stretching and really drives. Since timing is not used to measure speed, the dog's manner of "putting out" is an important means of assessing its ability to cover ground.

AGILITY: (Max 25 Points)

The ability to move quickly and easily; nimbleness in negotiating terrain, which may cause a dog to slip or slide; turning without going wide or cutting or breaking stride; co- ordination of movement.

ENDURANCE: (Max 20 Points)

Lasting quality, stamina of physical and mental concentration. Credit is given to the dog, which does not fade, or pull up or slacken.

PENALTIES

LOOSE DOG PENALTY: - 25 points

The penalty of twenty-five [25] points shall be given against a dog that is found loose anywhere on the grounds on the day. It will have no effect on the dog's overall yearly rating or grading

PRE-SLIP PENALTY: - 5 points

For dogs whose handlers start their dogs before the Hunts Master has given the "Go" command.

COURSE DELAY PENALTY: - 5 points

Dogs which delay their course or whose handlers delay the course may be penalised, but not through trying to retrieve the lure upon completion of the course.

This is how a judge assesses the performance of your dog. Even though a judge's decision is final you are welcome to discuss your dog's performance or ask for help in case of non-performance, with any of the judges present on the day.


